


The Page Coach, Kids Need to Read's mobile outreach unit providing literary treasure to disadvantaged children, proudly served 78,004 children during the 2021-2022 fiscal year (April 1, 2021–March 31, 2022), distributing inspiring books and literacy programming at a diverse array of schools, libraries, and literacy events in low socioeconomic communities throughout the states of Arizona, California and Nevada. This represented an 20% increase over the 62,450 children served by the program the previous year. The number of reading resources provided by the program also grew, from 130,845 books valued at \$883,017 during 2020–2021 to 135,601 books valued at \$941,303. The average poverty rate of clients served was 85%.

Surveys were sent to agencies that received visits from The Page Coach. The surveys are structured to gauge an increased desire to read after the program. This included interactive presentations, as well as book giveaway events. Of the forty-six Page Coach survey respondents, twenty-one reported 100% increased desire to read after the program. Nine reported a 90–85% increased desire to read, and two reported less than 70% observation of an increased desire to read. Fourteen respondents could not estimate a percentage, but provided positive feedback, such as this:

This is evident in the increase of requests from schools, libraries, governmental agencies, and nonprofit service programs across the state.




